School Supplies




Students do not need to bring any school supplies from home. I will provide them with:

Volunteering




Volunteers are always welcome!

Teacher observations of student progress will be on going

Formal assessments will be given at the end of each trimester both one on one and in small group

Iready (our computer program) will have three diagnostic windows each trimesterand will put students on a learning path based on their results.

THow to help your child at home

- Work with them on recognizing and writing their name
- Work with them on recognizing both capital and lowercase letters
- Practice the kindergarten sight words with them
- Read to them and set aside time for them to point out any letters and words they know in the book.
- Give them a pencil, paper, and time to practice writing their name, letters and numbers and if capable words too
- Practice counting with them 1-100
- Help them learn to recognize numbers 1-30
- Let them count objects and items around the house to build one to one correspondence
- Rhyme with them through talking, rhyming games or rhyming songs
