WHAT IS TITLE 1?

Revenue source of categorical supplemental programs

Designed to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach, at minimum, proficiency on state academic achievement standards and assessments.

Funds **MUST** be used to supplement core programs to enhance student achievement

Cannot pay for classroom buildings, reading and math curriculum, etc.

2. Our school works on “School-wide Program” so that Title I supports ALL STUDENTS needing academic support to reach grade level standards



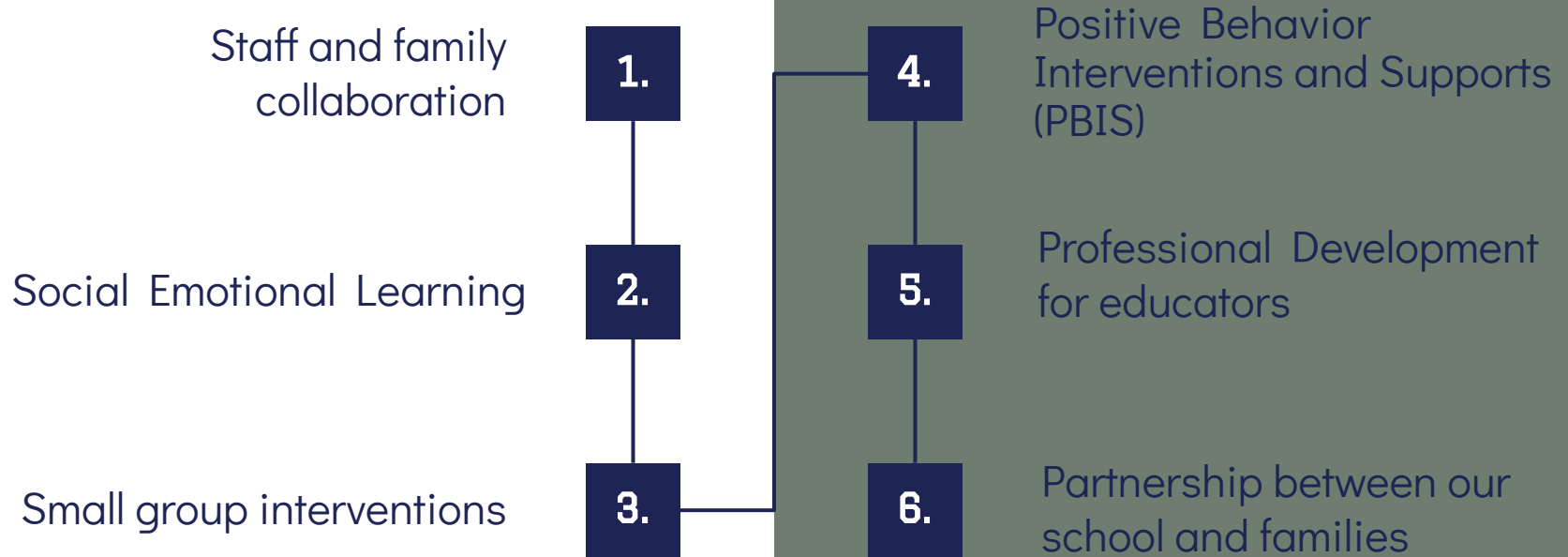
STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

SCHOOL SITE COUNCIL (SSC) AND ENGLISH LEARNER ADVISORY COMMITTEE (ELAC)



SSC: School Site Council (SSC) is a site based group consisting of parents and teachers elected by their peers to assist with the governance of the school. Meets 4 – 5 times during the year.

ELAC: English Learner Advisory Committee (ELAC) is a site based group made up of all parents of English learners. Although this group is not a governing body, it provides a forum for parents to have input on school issues.

PARENT-SCHOOL COMPACT
